He lovingly coined that team, The Lady Bombers. Greg not only taught the game, but the values of teamwork, discipline, and perseverance. He devoted much of his life to helping young men and women by coaching youth sports, leaving a lasting impact on countless athletes. He proudly wore his "Coach" title like a badge of honor. In fact many in the community still call him and think of him as Coach Egan.
