



Larry Kirshner

August 10, 1935 - June 25, 2023

Throughout his 87 years, Larry Kirshner lived a life in pursuit of knowledge and culture. Born in an Orthodox Jewish family in the Bronx to Daniel and Rose, he was the youngest of three. He told his daughter stories about the movies and Rangers hockey games he enjoyed as a child and teenager, as well as plays he attended with his father. He continued this tradition with his young family.

His undergraduate degree and his Master's in Social Work were earned at Yeshiva University. He started working at a YM-YWHA and continued to work in the community service field first as a clinical social worker and then an executive director in New York, Montreal, PQ, and New Jersey until his retirement.

He had a beautiful singing voice and loved singing in Shul, on Shabbos and holidays with family and enjoying songs from musical theater with his wife Doreen. His love for theater and dance was matched only by his interest in sports—basketball and hockey topping the list.

He was also a man who loved winning at Scrabble against his wife when he could, playing board games with family, and staying current with the news, especially the New York Times, which he read in its entirety every weekend, with his wife and continuing after her passing in 2020.

Larry Kirshner is survived by his daughter, son-in-law, and beloved grandchildren in Florida where he lived at the end of his life, as well as by his nephews and nieces, their children, and close friends and family.
